Port Report



Airport Feasibility Summary

The Port and City held the first of two Town Hall meetings around the topic of the recently completed Airport Feasibility Study. The Town Hall meetings were a commitment by both the Port Commission and the City Council following filing of the final report by the consultants ECONWest. Approximately 50 people attended the meeting that was held in the Pavilion on September 12. During the meeting, Port staff conducted a summary review of the full Airport Feasibility report. The purpose of the meeting was to educate the community on the final report as well as encourage discussion within the community as well as begin discussion regarding the desired long-term use of the land. The state owns approximately 47 acres that is currently zoned Public, Open Space and Low Density Residential. The Port Commission has included making safety and operational improvements at the Airport in the Ports 2019 Legislative priorities. Recommended improvements include lengthening and widening the runway, install hangars, add runway lighting, construct proper restrooms, new fencing, signage and an electronic monitoring system. The Port will be lobbying for these enhancements to improve the airport. The general agreement among those in attendance is that the airport should stay there and that some safety improvements are needed. Additionally, it was agreed that the airport should stay in its current location. A second Town Hall meeting will be held in January or February of 2019.

Extended Bus Service

Columbia Area Transit (CAT) has added another bus to their service; the Columbia Gorge Commuter Express. This public transit service is part of the CAT system and will serve commuters heading east or west and to/from Portland and Hood River. Fare starts October 1st and is \$10 each way. The annual Marine Park Winterization will begin on October 1st. As the season ends, we take steps to protect the pipes and irrigation system throughout the park. The target is to complete winterization by October 31st. Some steps to bring attention to are: restrooms in Center Park will close, as well as restrooms and showers in the campground, water service will be shut off to campground sites 5-12 (1-4 have water year-round), water service to the Marina will be shut off, along with water service to the cook shacks. 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Pony Task Force Update

Mark Your Calendar: The Pony Task Force is finalizing their work on recommendations to the regarding the Port Commission Building. The Task Force has come up with an exciting option that would create a visitor center, renovate the Museum and construct a new Pony building near the north west end of the current Museum building. The Task Force has set October 29 at 7 pm in The Pavilion for a community meeting review the recommendations before final presentation to the Commission in December. Included in the Task Force concept are a remodeling of the current Museum building, constructing a new Pony building that will include space for a visitor center as well as class room and activity space in the new Pony Building. The idea is to create an enhancement to the community's year around economic development and provide an exciting and educational approach to the history of the community. Featured would be the historic locks, transportation over time in Cascade Locks, the Pony with interpretive displays and a permanent visitor center.
