Update from the Museum

Cascade Locks Historical Museum has reopened to the public daily from 11am-4pm through September 30. The museum will also be open through October this year, closed on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Local admission is \$1, and local students are free, including recently-graduated seniors. The museum is following CDC coronavirus sanitation recommendations and masks are required for entry. The museum's seasonal exhibit, "Patching a Community," features local guilts. While the museum's Annual Membership Meeting was postponed indefinitely, you still can renew your membership at the museum or purchase membership new online а at cascadelocksmuseum.org/donate. Family memberships are just \$35 and include unlimited admission to the museum for 2 adults and 4 children for one year. Purchase or renew your Family membership during the Membership Drive from July 26- August 1 and receive two complimentary tickets Sternwheeler. to ride the New! Columbia Gorge Museums Pass offers free admission to nine regional museums. Proceeds will be shared between museums to help recover from pandemic closures. Parking on Port Properties

On Thursday July 16th, the Port Commission passed an Ordinance on parking that will allow for the Port to regulate parking on Port-owned properties in order to monitor and prevent the gathering of mass crowds and comply with the current health and safety guidance. There will be a resolution going before the Commission in early August that will implement paid parking on Port-owned properties to non-residents of Cascade Locks. Residents of Cascade Locks will continue use of Port properties free of charge. While the details are continuing to be worked through, the program will operate through a mobile application that the user can pay for paid parking time by connecting their account to their license plate. The convenience of this application system is that the user may add time to their parking session from wherever they are currently at in the park with no need to run back to their vehicle. The application can also send notifications to users who are nearing the end of their paid parking session, so that they can add time or return to their vehicle and avoid parking citations. The Port Staff will monitor paid parking sessions and have real time data on how many vehicles are in various Port owned locations and determine if closures are necessary to regulate proper social distancing. Revenue generated by the parking program will cover the cost of staff to monitor parking and help support Port programs. Residents will be issued free parking permits at various pop up locations over the next few weeks or will be available at the Port office. Meanwhile, please place the below temporary parking pass on your dashboard.
