Commission President Appointed to Fire Recovery Task Force

Port Commission President Jess Groves has been appointed to serve on the Governor's newly formed Fire Recovery Task Force. Jess joins six other local leaders in working with the Governor to fashion plans to help the area fully recover from the recent fires.

BOG 30 Year Plan

HDR, the Ports Bridge Engineer has begun work with Port staff on the updated long range plan for maintenance and preservation the of the BOG. This year's effort will attempt to create a 30 year plan that will identify exactly what needs to be done to keep the BOG operating at 80,000 pounds for the long term. The Maintenance and Preservation Plan is used by the Port to establish the annual budget for the BOG. This will be the fourth year of the plan since the 2013 weight limitation at the BOG. The plan is developed in collaboration with both WSDOT and ODOT who add immeasurably to the long range value of the effort. The BOG is a vital economic and safety amenity both for the community and the NSA.

Over the last few years, the business has experienced steady growth in business as well as attracting new visitors to town. They are expected to break ground on their \$1.5 million project in spring of 2018. We hosted the Building Bid opening for Flex 4 on October 10th and JH Kelly was awarded the bid on October 19th at the Commission Meeting. We hope to get the building slab poured before winter weather sets in. This will allow erection of the building as weather allows throughout the cold season.

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Commission Annual Work Session

Annually the Port Commission meets in special session with management staff to review Port operations, progress toward achieving approved objectives as well as setting the new priorities for the upcoming budget year. The past two years, this special work session was held in the Port District boundary at Cooper Spur. This year, the Special Work Session will be held in town on November 3 and 4. The special work session will begin at 6 pm and the team will work until 10pm. Work will commence first thing Saturday and run until 12 noon. This year's Special Work Session will be held at Bridgeside Restaurant. The Special Work Session will review and set preliminary priorities and objectives for the development of the 2018-19 Budget. Formal action on this topic will take place in January at a regularly scheduled Port Commission meeting.

Marine Park Winterized

The annual Marine Park Winterization has begun. As the season ends, we take steps to protect the pipes and irrigation system throughout the park. The target is to complete winterization by October 31st. Some steps to bring attention to are: restrooms in Center Park are now closed, restrooms and showers in the campground are now closed, water service has been shut off to campground sites 5-12 (1-4 have water year round), water service to the Marina has be shut off, and water service to the cook shacks has been shut off.
