Port Report

New Bridge Tolls

The Port Commission adopted revised tolls will go into effect July 1, 2016. New in the toll system is a special rate for low income individuals, local decals for those living in the local zone and color coded axle coupons for the trucks. The focus of all tolls is the axle number. For residents of the local zone, the local sticker/decal or a coupon book will allow crossing the Bridge of The Gods for \$1 each way. Anyone without a sticker or coupon book will pay \$2 to cross each way. Anyone regardless of place of residence may purchase and use coupons. The decals will be available soon at the Port offices and at the Skamania Chamber of Commerce. The Port has developed a 10 Year Maintenance and Preservation Plan for the bridge and is working diligently to ensure the BOG operates at 80,000 pounds for a long time. The Plan calls for the Port to spend \$3,628,800 over the ten years with federal grants in the amount of \$10,634,000.

4th of July

The Port looks forward to hosting its annual 4th of July Celebration in the Marine Park this year. This event has been made possible through generous donations by major sponsors including Let's Truck and AWI Columbia Gorge. This year will feature The Stingrays playing live from 7pm-10pm sponsored by the Cascade Locks Downtown Business Association. Vendors include Jumpin' Jax Java, Brigham Fish Market, Cascade Locks Lion's Club, Raven's Nest Public House and Brainless Tees. The Lion's Club will also host a Ducky Derby through the canal. There will not be a fee to park but the Port will be accepting donations to help keep this special event going. Parking is limited but visitors will still be allowed inside the park to drop off people and supplies once we're full.





Rock Steps for Trails – PCTA

The number one rule of rocks for trail building is, "if you can pick it up, it's too small. If you can roll it, it's still too small. If it takes two people to roll it, now we're talking." The PCT is a horse trail so you really need heavy rocks. We used mostly rock bars and pick mattocks, which are hand tools that make rock moving a lot easier, even for small people. Students learned to skid and flip using these tools for leverage. We also had rock nets, the yellow webbing you see there. Normally it takes at least 4 people to carry these rocks with a rock net. Some of the larger rocks we wrapped with the rock net and then moved with a winch that provided tension to a high-line wire rope. We don't usually get to use that system in the wilderness. We often spend half our time searching for and harvesting rocks from all across the mountain. We were spoiled by having the Port deliver such a nice selection of rocks from the quarry. Layla Farahbakhsh and Pete Dewell of WTA were my co-leaders providing additional rock expertise.
